My Number

Why Not Make A “My Number” Card?

① What is a My Number card?

It is a card bearing your photograph that you can use to prove your “My Number” personal identification number and for personal identification. You can use it to complete online administrative procedures or receive certificates (such as a copy of your residence certificate or a certificate of family registration, tax certificate, or certificate of registered seal) at a convenience store, etc.

② Applying for a My Number card is easy!

Just bring a document that proves your identity (your residence card, driver’s license or health insurance card) to an application desk. (A reservation is required.) Please note that you will receive your card about one month after application.

The Nation’s First Katsu Kaishu Museum Opened on September 7th!



Katsu Kaishu was a shogunate retainer who lived during the turbulent late Edo and early Meiji periods. Considered to be a man of revolutionary thought for his day, he is known for traveling to the United States aboard the *Kanrin Maru* and striving to develop Japan’s navy among other accomplishments.

Ota City has opened a museum dedicated to Katsu Kaishu on the shore of his beloved Senzoku-ike pond. The museum utilizes and preserves the building of the former Seimei Bunko Library, a nationally registered tangible cultural property.

The Katsu Kaishu Museum presents Kaishu’s accomplishments and his connection to Ota City. It also relates his thoughts and describes the area’s history.
