The Ota City Tourist Information Center provides information for sightseeing in Ota City and nearby areas. It is certified (Category 2) by the Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO).

Offering a variety of multilingual tourist pamphlets, the center presents Ota City attractions that do not appear in guidebooks, including restaurants that are popular among the locals and sightseeing spots.

It is also a place to enjoy shopping for local handicrafts and specialty goods, including items in the "Selected 100 Souvenirs from Ota," and hosts participatory culture courses (such as "hands-on origami" and "bookmark-making") and seasonal exhibits and workshops.

Service in Japanese and English is always available, and there are people on staff who can speak Chinese, Korean, and Malay. Please visit the website for more information.

- Words used at school, glossary, etc.


A “parent/guardian”
