Ota City's "Community Cycle" System


This bicycle-sharing system lets you rent and return a bicycle at any bicycle port located within a service area covering 11 cities (special wards) of Tokyo, including Ota City. There are about 90 ports within Ota City alone. Use them to make your commuting, shopping, and sightseeing more convenient. (Membership registration is required.)



- When** Available 24 hours a day
- Where** Around 860 locations in Tokyo (around 90 locations in Ota City)
- Cost**
 - Single-use member: 165 yen for the first 30 minutes (110 yen charged for each additional 30 minutes)
 - Monthly member: 2,200 yen per month (good for unlimited rides of up to 30 minutes per time; 110 yen charged for each additional 30 minutes)
 - One-day pass: 1,650 yen (valid until 11:59 pm on the day of use)
- Capacity** Each person who registers for membership can use one bicycle.

A Reminder about Illegally Parked Bicycles and Bicycle Theft



Please do not park your bicycle on streets or near train stations. Unattended bicycles can obstruct pedestrians and block the passage of emergency vehicles.

It's also important to note that bicycles left on the street or near a station could be stolen or impounded by Ota City. Be sure to park your bicycle in a bicycle parking lot.

Streets are not the only places where bicycles are stolen.

Many are stolen from homes and parking lots. This makes it important to lock your bicycle to make it harder to steal. Using two locks is even better, as it forces the thief to work longer.

Protect your bicycle by using two locks.

Return of Medical Expenses after Loss of Eligibility for National Health Insurance

If you have joined your company's health insurance scheme or moved out of Ota City, be sure to notify Ota City that you will leave the Ota City National Health Insurance program and return the insurance card that was issued to you.

Joining your employer's health insurance scheme or moving out of Ota City will cause you to lose your eligibility for the Ota City National Health Insurance program from the date that you joined the other scheme or moved. This means that you will no longer be able to use the insurance card for Ota City's program.

If you visit a medical facility using the Ota City program's insurance card without eligibility, you will be required to return the portion of the medical expenses that were covered by Ota City (between 70% and 80% of the total medical expense) and personally make a claim for that portion with your new health insurance scheme.

If you will visit a medical facility before your new insurance card is issued, please consult with the health insurance scheme that is processing your card and notify the medical facility that your card is still being processed.

Ota City's Benefit-Type Scholarship Program for Students Going on to High School, etc.

Ota City offers a "benefit-type scholarship" program for people planning to enter a high school, college of technology, specialized training college, or similar institution who have difficulty attending school for economic reasons and who meet certain academic performance criteria.


* All program requirements and selection criteria must be met. Please contact the office mentioned below for information on these requirements and criteria.

* Please note that some applicants may not be selected even if they satisfy the selection criteria if many applications are received.

When	Application period: Tentatively scheduled for between early September and early October 2021 Timing of payment: Tentatively scheduled for bank transfer in March before enrollment
Amount	80,000 yen (one payment per eligible person)
How to apply	Bring in the necessary forms or send them by post.

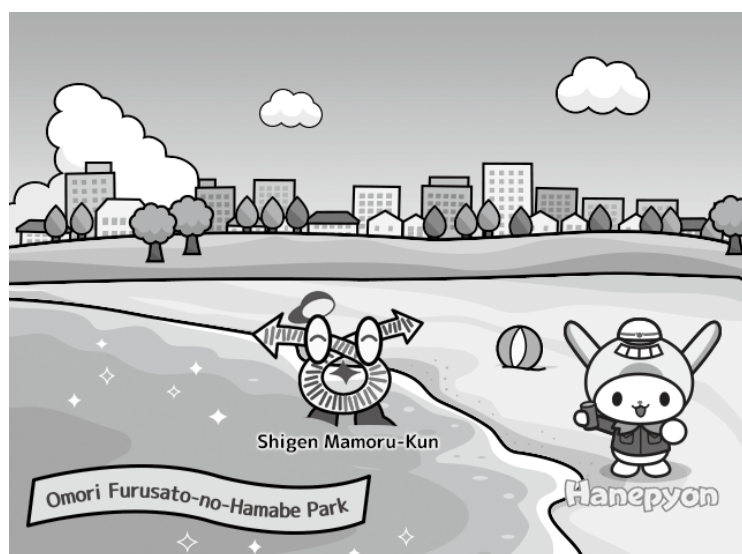

Special Exhibit “Hasui Kawase”

Hasui Kawase was an artist who lived and worked for much of his life in Ota City. He traveled on foot throughout Japan and created seasonal prints of the places he visited. It is said that he produced over 600 works during his lifetime.

This special exhibit, which will be divided into two sections, will present works from Hasui’s entire career – from his start as an artist until his later years – as well as his sketchbooks, diaries, favorite items, and photographs. The first section will mainly feature scenes of Tokyo, Hasui’s birthplace and a place of special emotional attachment for him. The second section will present scenes of the places that Hasui visited as an enthusiastic traveler.
