## **Please Follow the Waste Disposal Rules**

Your household produces waste and recyclables every day. But have you ever wondered about how to sort them? Here we look at waste sorting that is often done incorrectly.

#### 1) Bulky waste

Any item measuring about 30 cm or more on one side is considered bulky waste. Even if the item has been disassembled and placed into a bag, it is still considered bulky waste if its original size was 30 cm or more.

#### 2) Differences in material

The disposal method changes depending on the item's materials and the percentages of those materials. Use the disposal method for the material that comprises the largest part of the item.

Ota City distributes a pamphlet titled "How to dispose and separate your waste and recyclable waste" (available in English, Chinese, Korean, Tagalog, Nepali, and Vietnamese). Please refer to it if you have questions about the sorting and disposal of items not mentioned above.

### Important Information on Bicycle Thefts and Parking Lots

Ota City wishes to remind you not to park your bicycle on streets or near train stations. Always use a bicycle parking lot. Bicycles left around stations may be impounded.

There are many bicycle parking lots in Ota City. However, please note that parking hours and fees differ depending on the lot. Check with the lot you wish to use or visit its website for details.

Also bear in mind that many bicycle thefts occur in Ota City. Always remember to lock your bicycle, even when parking it at your home or in a bicycle parking lot.

Using two locks is even better, as it forces the thief to work longer. Protect your bicycle by using two locks.

# **Bicycle Street Markings and Lines**

Ota City has painted markings and lines on streets in the city to guide bicycles. They are positioned on the left side of the roadway and indicate where bicycles should ride.

- Ride safely in the direction indicated by the arrows.
- Yield to other riders when necessary.
- At intersections without traffic lights, obey traffic rules and manners, such as stopping and making sure the way is safe by looking left and right.
- Pass vehicles parked on the street only after checking that there are no vehicles approaching from behind.

- Please do not come to the venue by car.








