Where to go for treatment if you are injured in a major earthquake

If a major earthquake occurs, first-aid stations will be set up on the grounds of hospitals and other facilities for a period of about 72 hours following the event.

When

When an earthquake with a seismic intensity of “6-lower” or higher occurs in Ota City

Anyone who is injured and desires treatment by a doctor
